

How Do I Use The Breeders' Report?

Frequently Asked Questions

Why are some of the horses in the Show Results section in red?

We've been working throughout the winter to gather sire and dam information on all the horses in the High Point REPORT. If we do not have the sire and dam information on a horse, the horse shows up in our show results in red

If your horse shows up in red, please call our office with your horse's papers in hand so that we can make sure your horse's breeding records are up to date. Ask for Jan Ontiveros at 931-684-8123 or email her at Ontiveros@horseworld.net.

 My horse has won this season and his points aren't showing under his stallion.
 What is wrong?

There are a couple of reasons his points might not show up. It might be that we don't have the sire and dam information for your horse. If so, his name will appear in red in the show results and you can call our office to give us that information.

Or perhaps the show results did not reflect his registered name. For our information to be complete and correct, it is important that horses are shown according to their correct registered name. If your horse is not receiving points correctly in the High Point REPORT or the Stallion REPORT due to being shown under a different name, call our office to give us the details.

 I'd like to see how the stallions stack up as a percentage of the total offspring produced.

That's a great idea and one we are considering for our 2008 update. We're also gathering data for progeny searches so that you can search our database for full siblings and see how they've performed. You'll also be able to check your broodmare's bloodline against different stallions bloodlines and see how well they've crossed so far. What I can learn...

- You can make better breeding decisions for your broodmare by seeing which sires are producing the offspring in the divisions you like, for example if you want American Saddlebred Five-Gaited babies, or colts suitable for Morgan Hunter Pleasure classes.
- You can study the results in individual categories, or in overall divisions.
- You can see which sire is doing best overall across all the categories.

Where do I start?


In the left hand menu choose
Breeders' Report. Then select the
American Saddlebred or Morgan
database. This will take you to the
Overall Results. Study the list. If
you want more detail on a particular
stallion, click on his name to see all
the offspring that have earned points
in the High Point REPORT, individually
organized by the category they earned



the points in. You can even click on the name of the offspring to see what shows he earned the points at.

When you think you have all the answers, check out the Overall Divisions by returning to the Stallion REPORT Home and clicking on the Overall Divisions buttons, for example, Overall Three-Gaited, or Overall Morgan Pleasure Driving. This will give you the complete list of categories we've broken down the result by and just under Overall are the Overall Divisions.

Finally, select categories that you enjoy watching to see how the stallions stack up in the individual areas. The sires leading the Show Pleasure Driving



category are very different than those leading the Open Five-Gaited, so be sure you're picking a stallion who excels in the divisions you are breeding for.

We are working with the AMHA to gather the data for our current Morgan show ring champions. The AMHA is unveiling their online registry soon and our Morgan database will be up to date shortly after that.
