AMERICAN SADDLEBREDS – ROADSTERS HACKNEYS – FRIESIANS HIGH POINT REPORT

OPEN FIVE-GAITED

It was Vanity Blue in the top spot of the open five-gaited High Point Report, netting a total of 143 points from six horse shows. The son of Deep Blue and Vanity's Gypsy Town represented owners Mimi Kyle and Nancy Bryan throughout the season with Camille Cowart as his sole rider. Together, Cowart and Vanity Blue were named the Five-Gaited Reserve Grand Champions at Pro-Am Benefit, Asheville Saddlebred Classic, Shenandoah, and the North Carolina State Championship after earning victories and top ribbons in Open Five-Gaited qualifier. They claimed the respectable sixth place ribbon in the Five-Gaited Gelding Stake in Louisville and were garnered the red ribbon in the Open Five-Gaited offering in their final appearance of the year at Ocala International.

Rockband, the High Point Report winner for the last two years had to settle for reserve this year. Harold Denton Jr.'s The Wish Card sired entry garnered 132 points with Clark Clouse in the saddle. Rockband celebrated a nearly undefeated season with wins at Southern Saddlebred Spring Fling, Cleveland Tri-State Charity, All American Horse Classic, and Alabama Charity. He was additionally the Five-Gaited Grand Champion and Five-Gaited Gelding Stake winner at Lexington Junior League and ended his season with two third place prizes from the UPHA/American Royal.

LADIES FIVE-GAITED

Dazzlelight's name was found at the top of the ladies five-gaited leaderboard after a victorious season worthy of 172 points. A.E. Nelson's daughter of Bob Bobaloo achieved success with both Dena Lopez and Andrea Smith in the saddle. Dazzlelight was the Ladies Five-Gaited Grand Champion at Bridlespur and Rock Creek and earned top ribbons at Bonnie Blue National, Shenandoah, Lexington Junior League, and Shelbyville. The mare then triumphed in Freedom Hall with a third place finish in the Ladies Five-Gaited Mares offering as well as the fourth place prize in the Ladies Five-Gaited World's Championship.

Texas Pete was a mere two points behind Dazzlelight to land in the reserve spot on the ladies five-gaited High Point Report. A total of 170 points was awarded to Susan Swope's Master Class sired gelding. Swope turned the reins of Texas Pete over to Kim Cowart in 2021, who garnered points from four horse shows. Texas Pete was the Ladies Five-Gaited Grand Champion at both Asheville Saddlebred Classic and Ocala International. He garnered additional reserve finishes at Shenandoah, but perhaps his most stellar performances came in Freedom Hall. Kim Cowart piloted the entry to be named the Ladies Five-Gaited Geldings World's Champion before earning the roses as the Ladies Five-Gaited World's Champion of Champions.

AMATEUR FIVE-GAITED

The amateur High Point Report featured CH What Was I Thinking in first place. Kate Baumann's Desert's Supreme Memories sired entry landed in the top spot of the amateur leaderboard with 191 points. CH What Was I Thinking swept the amateur five-gaited ranks at Bridlespur, May Classic, Oshkosh Charity, and Wisconsin Futurity. He scored additional tricolors from Mane Event and FASH and garnered top ribbons from ASAW Summerfun.

Apocalyptic followed CH What Was I Thinking in the reserve spot with 189 points. The son of Kalarama's All Time High was presented by owner Alyssa Curry at seven horse shows under the direction of High Veld Farm. Curry and Apocalyptic began the season with strong performances at Kentucky Spring Premier and Asheville Saddlebred Classic. They were then named the Ladies Amateur Five-Gaited Reserve Grand Champions at both Rock Creek and Lexington Junior League. While in Freedom Hall, this pair garnered a competitive fourth place prize in the Ladies Amateur Five-Gaited Geldings Section One offering before taking home the sixth place ribbon in the ladies amateur world's championship. They then earned a ladies amateur tricolor from the Kentucky Fall Classic before ending their season with top prizes at the Ocala International.

JUNIOR EXHIBITOR FIVE-GAITED

The crowd consistently got behind the slick racking Slash Hundred Proof in 2021. His victorious performances landed him at the top of the junior exhibitor five-gaited High Point Report. Daneli Miron directed her son of A Superb Manhattan to earn 208 points from nine horse shows. Together, they earned the reserve streamers and additional reserve honors in the five-gaited ranks from Southern Saddlebred Spring Fling, KASPHA May Classic, Rock Creek, and Lexington Junior League. Slash Hundred Proof was the Junior Exhibitor Five-Gaited victor from ARHPA, Shelbyville and Alabama Charity, and scored impressive ribbons on the Saddlebred breed's biggest stages. While in Freedom Hall, he earned two fourth place prizes from the junior exhibitor five-gaited 14-17 division and garnered third and fifth place finishes from the UPHA/American Royal.

Riverdreams' Spitfire and Sophia Anderson capped their widely successful first year together with 195 points and the reserve position on the junior exhibitor leaderboard. The Marc Of Charm sired entry excelled under the direction of Evan and Mary Orr, sweeping the junior exhibitor ranks at Southern Saddlebred Spring Fling, Shenandoah Classic, Lexington Junior League, and the North Carolina State Fair. He scored a yellow ribbon as well as a sixth place finish while on the green shavings and finished his season as the Junior Exhibitor Five-Gaited 14-17 winner in Kansas City at the UPHA/American Royal.

JUNIOR FIVE-GAITED

Riverdreams' Spitfire's stablemate, Monnington Veiled Mistress also captured a spot on the High Point Report, rising to the top of the junior five-gaited lead-

board. The Marc Of Charm sired mare was a popular competitor this year both with trainer Evan Orr in the saddle as well as owner Vickie Byrd. Veiled Mistress netted 127 points with her reserve finishes in the junior division at J.D. Massey, Asheville Saddlebred Classic, and Shenandoah. She was the Junior Five-Gaited Reserve Grand Champion at Lexington Junior League and finished with the impressive fourth place prize in the Junior Five-Gaited Championship in Freedom Hall. The young mare then ended her season with a top ribbon from ASHAV.

The Vegas Edition's first year in the show ring resulted in the reserve finish on the junior five-gaited leaderboard. The son of North Vegas scored 97 points for owners Ceil and Kenny Wheeler. Smith Lilly was aboard the newcomer to garner impressive ribbons at both Shenandoah and the UPHA/American Royal. The Vegas Edition was the Junior Five-Gaited Grand Champion in Lexington and finished in the top three in Louisville's Junior Five-Gaited Championship.

THREE AND UNDER FIVE-GAITED

The three and under five-gaited division was immensely competitive with two entries tying for the reserve spot on the leaderboard. Arrowhead's Phenomenal led the way at the top of the chart with 105 points. The Rose Arbor Destiny sired entry starred in 2021 much to the delight of Covered Bridge Farm, Melissa Moore, and trainer Robert Gardiner. He was the UPHA Five-Gaited Classic victor to start the season at Midwest Charity. He then garnered the red ribbon in the same offering at Blue Ridge Classic. With Gardiner in the saddle, Phenomenal was crowned the ASHBA National Futurity Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited Reserve World's Champion as well as the Bill Wise ASB Sweepstakes Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited victor. His final appearance of the season came in Kansas City where he topped the UPHA Five-Gaited Classic Grand Championship.

Cornerstone's Ovation was one of two entries to claim the reserve spot on the three and under High Point Report with 80 points. The Mountainview's Heir To Fortune sired competitor represented owner Georgia Bulmer Ferreira with both Lionel Ferreira and Sarah MacKenna in the saddle. Ovation was the Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited victor at both Kentucky Spring Premier and Shelbyville. He was reserve in the UPHA

Five-Gaited Classic class at Bonnie Blue, Rock Creek, and Midwest Charity. He garnered additional points with the sixth place ribbon in Louisville's Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited Stallion/Gelding offering.

Tied with Cornerstone's Ovation at 80 points was I Have Magic. Faydelle Schott's daughter of That Handsome Face was presented throughout her debut season by Lauren Burin. I Have Magic made victory passes at Inter-County Triple and All American Horse Classic and was awarded with top ribbons at Indianapolis Charity and Lexington Junior League. She also earned an impressive third place ribbon on the green shavings in the Three-Year-Old Five-Gaited Mares class.



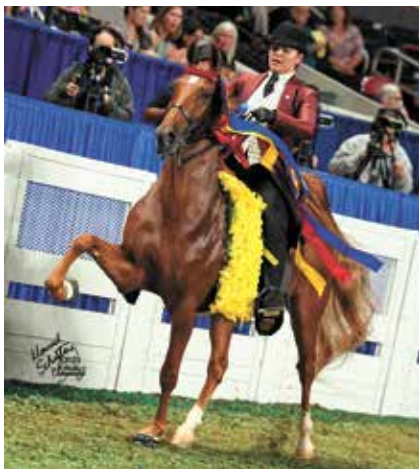

FIVE-GAITED PONY

It was no surprise that Macho Camacho's remarkable undefeated season resulted in the number one position on the five-gaited pony High Point Report with 220 points. Nissa Sultan's I'm A Lucky Charm sired entry won 12 classes from six shows all under the direction of Matt Shiflet. He swept the five-gaited pony division at J.D. Massey, Asheville, Shenandoah, North Carolina State Championships, and Ocala International. However, his most thrilling wins came as the Five-Gaited Pony World's Champion and the Five-Gaited Pony World's Champion of Champions.

Kate Smith and Leatherwood's Rita Bonita capped their season together with the reserve spot on the pony chart. The Leatherwood's Starlight sired mare excelled under the Mercer Springs banner with a total of 193 points. Rita Bonita was the Five-Gaited Pony Grand Champion at Raleigh Spring Premier, Bonnie Blue, Lexington Junior League, and ASHAV. She earned additional ribbons from Shenandoah and captured the sixth place ribbon in the Five-Gaited Pony Championship in Louisville. Kate Smith and Rita Bonita concluded their season in Kansas City with the reserve honors in the pony qualifier and the third place finish in the Five-Gaited Pony Stake.

This Nutcracker's Nirvana sired mare netted 195 points with trainer Albert Hertzog in the saddle. Crack Open The Cuervo swept the open three-gaited ranks at Mid-America Spring Fling, May Classic, and Wisconsin Futurity. She claimed top ribbons from Rock Creek, Lexington Junior League, and Mane Event and claimed a sixth place ribbon in the competitive Three-Gaited World's Grand Championship.

A total of 185 points was awarded to Ava Greer's Rain And Thunder. The son of Bobese was piloted by Bret Day to the reserve finish on the open three-gaited High Point Report. Rain And Thunder made three-gaited victory passes at J.D Massey Classic, Burlington Spring, Shenandoah, Lexington Junior League, Blue Ridge Classic, and North Carolina State Championship. He was fifth in Louisville's Three-Gaited Over 15.2 Stake and finished his successful year as the Three-Gaited Reserve National Champion after winning the over 15.2 qualifier in Kansas City.

For the second year in a row, CH Lady Mandolin landed in the first place position on the ladies three-gaited leaderboard. Maelee Dudan's Undulata's Nutcracker sired mare was awarded with 180 points for her performances in 2021 under the direction of Paul and Betsy Boone. CH Lady Mandolin's undefeated season featured eight wins. She swept the ladies division at Asheville, Shenandoah, and Blue Ridge before arriving in Freedom Hall. While on the green shavings, Lady Mandolin was the Ladies Three-Gaited 15.2 and Under World's Champion as well as the Ladies Three-Gaited World's Champion of Champions.

The ladies division is notorious for its stiff competition as evidenced in the tie for the reserve spot on the leaderboard. Both Callaway's Ivanka and Beckon The Blue netted 119 points in reserve. The Callaway's Blue Norther sired Callaway's Ivanka excelled under the direction of the Stachowski's. Ava Stachowski was in the saddle to sweep the ladies division at Rock Creek and earn the blue ribbon and tricolor from the ladies ranks at Lexington Junior League. Ivanka then capped her season with the yellow ribbon in Louisville's Ladies Three-Gaited 15.2 and Under offering and the sixth place prize in the Ladies Three-Gaited Championship.

Tied with Callaway's Ivanka was Beckon The Blue, also with 119 points. Ellie Kangur enjoyed a victorious debut season with her Deep Blue sired entry. Under the direction of Evan and Mary Orr, Beckon The Blue was piloted by Kangur as well as Kelly Lockhart. She was the Ladies Three-Gaited Grand Champion at Blowing Rock and the ladies reserve grand champion at both Shenandoah and Lexington Junior League. Her last appearance of the year came at Kansas City where she topped the Ladies Three-Gaited Under 15.2 class en route to the third place ribbon in the Ladies Three-Gaited National Stake.

Under the direction of Robert Gardiner, Kristi Gardiner enjoyed seven successful horse shows with her partner. Together, they made amateur victory passes at ARHPA, Midwest Charity, and Blue Ridge Classic. They made strong performances at Lexington Junior League and Kentucky Fall Classic and scored

two impressive ribbons at the Kentucky State Fair. One of their most memorable showings came in Kansas City as they were named the Amateur Three-Gaited Reserve National Champions.

A total of 176 points was awarded to Tra La Lady, the reserve winner on the amateur chart. Nancy Spaulding's season with her HS Daydream's Dignity sired mare featured amateur three-gaited tricolors at Des Moines Springfest, May Classic, and IASHPA Summer. She also scored reserve finishes and other top ribbons at Midwest Charity, Mane Event, and the All American Horse Classic. Tra La Lady garnered an eighth place finish in Louisville's competitive amateur ranks as well as the white ribbon from Kansas City.

They swept the junior exhibitor three-gaited division at Gasparilla Charity, Southern Saddlebred Spring Fling, Midwest Charity, and Lexington Junior League. Together, Gaskill and Heir Show excelled in Louisville, being crowned the Junior Exhibitor Three-Gaited 13 and Under Reserve World's Champion of Champions. They also earned a red ribbon from the 13 and under qualifier in Kansas City before garnering the third place prize in the 13 and under national championship.

Hailee Jump celebrated her first season with My Wishes And Dreams by climbing to the reserve spot on the junior exhibitor leaderboard with 185 points. The Pepper Hill Farm trained mare, sired by Solidarity SL, began her season as the Junior Exhibitor Three-Gaited victor at Mid-America Spring Fling. She additionally excelled as the junior exhibitor reserve grand champion at both ASAW Summerfun and St. Louis National Charity. FASH, May Classic, Midwest Charity, and Mane Event were also all locations where My Wishes And Dreams accrued points in the junior exhibitor ranks. The expressive mare also succeeded against stiff competition, finishing in the top five in Louisville, and the top 10 at the UPHA/American Royal.

With Matt Shiflet in the saddle, Lady Elegance was crowned the Junior Three-Gaited Over 15.2. Reserve World's Champion as well as the Junior Three-Gaited Reserve World's Champion of Champions. Her final appearance of the season came with Kenny Smith as the reserve finisher in the junior offering at the UPHA/American Royal.

Sedgefield's Best Story Ever's nearly undefeated season resulted in the reserve finish on the junior leaderboard. The daughter of Undulata's Nutcracker and CH Our Charming Lady netted 98 points for owner Hillcroft Farm LLC. Daniel Lockhart handled the riding assignments in 2021 piloting the mare to the Junior Three-Gaited win at Asheville and the reserve honors in Shenandoah. Her best finishes of the year came in Louisville where Best Story Ever was crowned the ASHBA Sweepstakes Four-Year-Old Three-Gaited World's Champion as well as the Junior Three-Gaited World's Champion of Champions.

The entry of Snap Dragon Saddlebreds LLC was the UPHA Three-Gaited Classic victor at Bridlespur, Midwest Charity, and St. Louis National Charity. He also secured the fourth place finish in Louisville's Three-Year-Old Three-Gaited offering. However, his most exciting performance came in Kansas City as he earned the prestigious title of the UPHA Three-Gaited Classic Grand Champion.

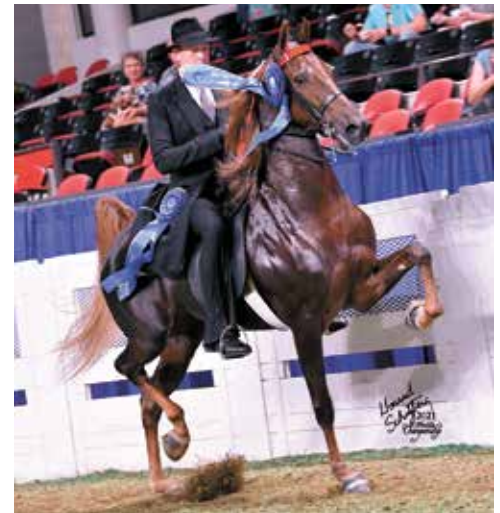
THREE AND UNDER PARK PLEASURE

City where King Of Swing ended his season as the UPHA Park Pleasure Classic Reserve Grand Champion.



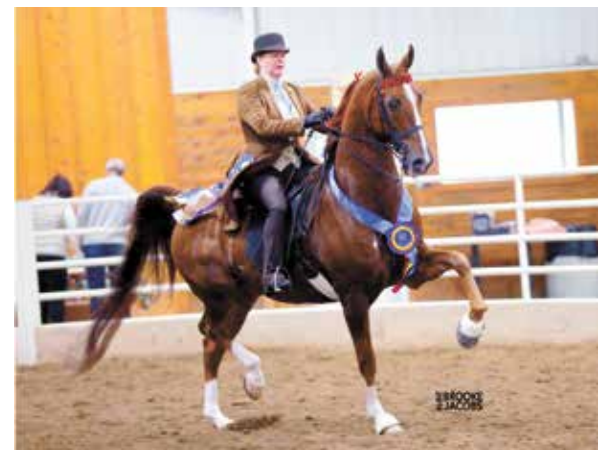
